As the first round of deadlines for the Ending the HIV Epidemic funding approaches, both health departments presented their "wish lists" which included:

- Partnerships with local jails to offer opt-out HIV testing
- Increased staffing and linkage-to-care services
- Improve providers' knowledge of HIV biomedical interventions
- Develop community syringe services programs
- Advocacy for policy level changes regarding HIV/AIDS
- Enhanced strategic marketing efforts
